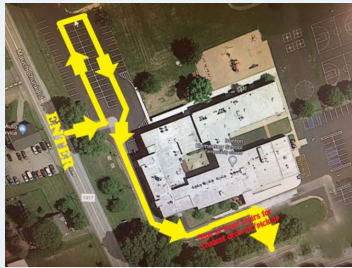

RTII (Response to Instruction and Intervention) is: A multi-tiered, school-wide approach providing interventions to students with academic needs.

RTII Includes:

- All Ironton students will participate in Intervention & Enrichment Time (TROT). This takes place daily. TROT will begin, school-wide, in the Fall.
- I collaborate with teachers to analyze student academic data.
- The goal of the RtII Approach is to help all Ironton students experience success in all areas of the curriculum.

Screenings: Physical Exam and Dental Exam, Vision and Hearing Screening, and Height and Weight (refer to nurse handout in packet for schedule of screenings)

Please be aware of severe food allergies. AVOID sending food that contains peanuts and tree nuts.



Remember to check your child's temperature and check for signs of illness **BEFORE** school.

DO NOT send your child to school in the morning IF:

- he/she has a fever (100 or over) - your child must be "fever free" for 24 hours without medication before sending him/her back to school.
- there is vomiting or diarrhea
- he/she has two of these symptoms: Lack of smell or taste (without congestion), headache, congestion or runny nose, sore throat, chills, muscle pain, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing.
- there is evidence of any suspicious skin rash or contagious disease



Please notify the nurse if your child has a communicable disease such as: chickenpox, pinkeye, impetigo, COVID-19 etc., or if you have reason to suspect head lice.

DO NOT SEND MEDICATION TO SCHOOL WITH STUDENTS. PARENTS MUST BRING MEDICATION TO SCHOOL WITH DOCTOR'S ORDERS.
